Introducing the NMPR

The PNC of Property

What is the National Mobile Property Register (NMPR)?

The NMPR is a single online property search system for the UK Law Enforcement agencies. For the first time ever it allows them to search any identifiable item of property to view its registered owners details, if it's been reported stolen to the system by the police anywhere in the UK, by the owner, the insurance company or in the case of a mobile phone, a network.

Virtually all the police forces in the UK use the NMPR with nearly a hundred thousand officers with access via their control centres, handheld devices and computer systems. Hundreds of thousands of checks have been run

since the system went live with many arrests and charges brought as a result of the information held on the NMPR database.

Mobile phone crime and the NMPR

The NMPR is central to the reduction and identification of mobile phone crime. As well as allowing officers to view ownership details of handset owners who have registered via immobilise.com it also allows them to view if a phone has been reprogrammed or if it's been blocked by the UK networks after it has been reported to them as lost or stolen.

The Public and the NMPR

Uniquely members of the public can interact with the NMPR by reporting their stolen property via the national property register at www.immobilise.com. This allows any force in the UK to view the owners details and any associated crime report information.



Public Advice

To help the Police identify stolen property register yours on www.immobilise.com. It is free and only takes a moment. Once registered if in the event of loss or theft you can flag the item and its details and your contact information will show on the NMPR.

Mobile Phones, MP3 Players and Other Mobile devices

Please ensure you protect yourself by not flaunting these items in public. Be careful where you use them, be aware of your surroundings and who is around you. Keep them on your person and don't leave them on bar tables etc.

Register your property on www.immobilise.com

Other Valuable Items

You can register as many items as you wish on Immobilise and it is free of charge. If you have any of them stolen ensure you flag them on your immobilise account so the UK Police can trace you, return the item and investigate criminal activity.

Data Suppliers

The NMPR looks at a large range of data supplied by various organisations.

Public

The Public can provide information via Immobilise.com by registering their property and reporting it as stolen or lost via their account.

Insurers

Insurers provide information to the NMPR when an insurance claim involves the theft of identifiable property. This system allows the insurers to interact directly with the Police and is a very powerful deterrent to fraudulent claims. Property Registration Services

Companies that supply property marking and registration services to the public can provide information to the police via the NMPR. If you are such a company and you wish to enhance your service by adding the functionality to your products please contact Recipero.

Trade Organisations

Trade Organisations and Retailers provide data to the NMPR as part of their customer care programmes. This data is normally provided via the immobilise.com website. If you feel your customers would benefit from having the ability to report the theft of any items they buy from you directly to the NMPR please contact Recipero for further details.

Police

All major UK Police forces provide data from their crime reporting systems on all stolen identifiable property. If your force only supplies partial information, for example only mobile phone data and you feel they should be providing details on all identifiable property please contact Recipero whose Police support team will assist in this process.
